From the Archives Road Trip

Pictured in the photo are Bill Fawcett, Buzz Bottimore, Bob Bottimore, and Jack Fawcett on their way to the Gold Discovery Centennial in Henry Need's Locomobile in 1948. The Centennial celebrated the 1848 discovery of gold in the millrace of John Sutter's sawmill under construction on the American River at Coloma. Bill Fawcett remembers that they met up with Herald resident Don Monseth at Coloma and they all spent the night in the Locomobile. Don stretched out on the front seat for the night, leaving the others to share the back seat. The Car they were driving was an older model as the Locomobile had stopped production in 1929. Don't know how reliable the car was or comfortable the ride was, but it must have been a fun trip. The photo was taken at the time by Kate Bottimore Georgi. Robert Fawcett donated the photo.

Policy and Procedure Review

Annual Form 990

I. Purpose:

- · As a nonprofit created under IRS section 501 (c) (3), the Gait Area Historical Society is required to file an annual Form 990-Return of Organizations Exempt from Income Tax.
- Form 990 is due on May 15th of each year; however, if the 15th falls on a weekend or legal holiday, it is due the next business day.

II. Related Documentation:

· Financial Reports summarizing Revenue and Expenditure Categories for each Fund; Detailed Ledger showing all Revenues and Expenditures for the year; support documentation for Revenues and Expenditures

III. Procedure:

- 1. Bookkeeper schedules appointment with Tax Preparer well in advance of the May 15th due date of Form 990.
- 2. Bookkeeper prepares/organizes the following to be submitted to the Tax Preparer in order for them to prepare Form 990:
 - a. Summary of Revenues and Expenditures for each fund
 - b. Detailed ledgers showing all Revenues and Expenditures that were received or paid during the year for each fund
 - c. VISA bills and support documentation
 - d. List of Officers
 - e. Any other information requested by Tax Preparer
 - f. List of government agencies that give financial support to the Society including the name of agency, address, amount of financial support, and designation of how funds are to be used
- 3. Bookkeeper is the liaison with the Tax Preparer to get any questions answered.
- 4. Once Form 990 is prepared, Bookkeeper gets appropriate Board Member to sign and mails/electronically files the Form by the due date. If mailed. Bookkeeper obtains certified mail receipt.
- 5. If the Tax Preparer is unable to complete Form 990 by the May 15th due date and has to file an extension, Bookkeeper notifies President of the G AHS that an extension has been filed.
- 6. Bookkeeper maintains permanent copy of annual Form 990

Galt Cemetery's Oldest "Resident"

A few months ago, we listed the names of several Galt residents from the past but lacked the information. GAHS member John Abraham came through with information on Thomas Armstrong from Hutchins Illustrated California Magazine. All we knew about him came from old Historical Society records that named him as the oldest burial in the Galt Cemetery. Armstrong passed away in 1860, nine years before Galt's founding. There is more to the story of Galt Cemetery's oldest "resident."

Thomas Armstrong was born in Northumberland, England, in February 1818. he left home at an early age to be an apprentice engraver. Engraving is the practice of cutting a design onto a hard, flat surface by cutting grooves into it with a steel tool called a burin. Armstrong's engraving material of choice was copper, which printers used to produce pictures in various publications. Once he became accomplished at his craft, he went to

work for the Illustrated London News and other local publications. In 1840, he married his first wife Ann and, in the next two years, welcomed a daughter Francis and son John.

In 1848, the Armstrongs moved to Paris for a few months before traveling to Australia, where Ann died. Hearing of the California Gold Rush, Thomas Armstrong took his two children and moved to San Francisco. Instead of heading for the goldfields, he found a job doing what he did best, where he produced the first-ever view of San Francisco. In 1850, Armstrong became the publisher of the short-lived Illustrated California News, the first pictorial newspaper on the Pacific Coast.

In the mid-1850s, Thomas Armstrong moved on to other ventures in the Sacramento area, where he did freelance work for other newspapers like the Placer Times and the Sacramento Union. In 1855, he married Galt area resident Jane Kelso McKinstry Howard and lived here for a brief period. Thomas and Jane produced a daughter named Jennie. Having moved back to San Francisco, Armstrong went to work for Hutchins Illustrated California Magazine. On the night of December 21, 1860, he finished his last piece called "Library of the What Cheer House." He got up from his table complaining about not feeling well and went to bed. He passed away that night.



The following part of the story is purely speculation based on cultural practices in the 1860s. Jane Armstrong brought her husband back to the area for burial in the family plot. We think the present cemetery property belonged to Jane Armstrong's family, and they had lived on the property a few years before. When the Armstrongs lived in the area, they used the post office in Liberty, a mile from the burial plot. The town of Galt didn't exist in 1860. When Jane Armstrong died in 1897, she was buried alongside her husband, Thomas. Thanks for the information John.


















Liberty School House Update
