Educating Our Community on Galt Area History

Many people think we represent only the history of the City of Galt; when we, actually support, preserve and protect the history of the Galt area communities. Those areas are Thornton, Elliott, Liberty, Herald, Colony, Hicksville/Arno, and Clay as well as Galt. It is obvious from the excitement that our Historian, Dan Tarnasky's "Snapshots of Galt History" on Facebook has generated, we have residents and former residents who are very interested in our past; and enjoy looking at the old photos of the town and our people. We also have people who live here now but do not know about our past, how did Galt come to be where it is, who named Galt, what significance is Liberty?

It is our role to educate our residents and the children about our history. Many school children come to Pioneer Days at the McFarland Living History Ranch each school year. However, most of those children are not from the Galt area.

I have contacted the Superintendent of the Elementary School District in Galt and we are going to meet to see if there is a way that Galt History can be presented to the students. If we can formulate a plan, we want to bring Thornton, Archoe (Herald and Clay), and Oak View (Elliott and Liberty)

into this also. It would be great if we could have the field trips again to the Rae Museum and to the McFarland Home. Perhaps our walking map of downtown and old town Galt could be worked into this. We have the momentum going with the Snapshots of Galt History. Remember one day these students will be our next generation of Galt Area Historical Society members. These student's excitement of what they learn, will be taken home. Their parents will want to explore more too and see what we have to offer.

Let's make our goal to continue to educate our area about our history. Our archives are extensive. It is like parents passing on their old photos, mementos, and personal effects to their heirs. We are passing on what we have saved and preserved for the future generations to continue with our work. We want them to be educated so they can continue to pass our history along and to love our community as we do. I am very proud of the Galt Area Historical Society. We have done so much in the 30 plus years since we organized. For a city our size, we have archives that ranks next to some of the biggest. That is because of our members and what was passed along and told to us. We have an obligation to future generations to do the same through education.

January Meeting Report!

Society members have been busy planning upcoming events including Rose Pruning at

the Rae House in February, Kite Day in April and An Evening in Italy dinner in May. Members are considering doing a Fireworks booth but no final decision was made. A solar light will be purchased for the flag pole at the Rae House Museum. After the meeting, our Historian, Dan Tarnasky, presented a film on the 1947 Sacramento County Fair. The Sacramento County Fair was established in 1937 on what is now the Galt Flea Market, Chabolla Center, Galt Swimming Pool and Fairsite School. It remained in Galt until 1954 when it was moved to Sacramento. The film showed local participants showing horses and cows in the ring, horse racing, and prefair entertainment of motorcycle trick riding. Members enjoyed going back in time by watching the film while munching on appetizers and desserts!

Dr. Frederick William Harms was a native of Pleasanton, Alameda County, and graduated from Stanford University Medical School in 1895. After practicing medicine in Berkeley for three years, Dr. Harms moved to Galt in 1898 where he practiced for the next fifty-eight years. At the time of his retirement, he was thought to be the oldest practicing physician in Northern California. His community involvement included the Galt Masonic Lodge #267, Valley Oaks Grange, and Order of Eastern Star.
